

#### 1. Mesh Installation


- Make sure you stretch the piece of mesh thoroughly so you're able to form a good pocket.
- Prepare the mesh by folding over the first row of holes so that they overlap the third row. (See illustration at the top right.)


## 2. Top Leather Thong

- Stretch top leather thong before stringing.
  (This will prevent leather from loosening at a later time.)
- With the underside of the head up, lay the mesh in place with the overlap towards you. Tie hole #1 of mesh to the first hole in the head with leather thong.
- Continue to work across the top of the head, tying the second, fourth, sixth, eighth and ninth mesh holes to their corresponding holes in the head as shown.
   Be sure each loop is pulled tight.

### 3. Sidewall Laces

- Start sidewall lacing by tying hitch knot in the second hole from top (see diagram to the right).
- Proceed to put lace through mesh and then work down sidewall, looping lace between sidewall holes and mesh repeatedly (see diagram). NOTE: Which holes you use is based on preference).
- Tie off lace at bottom in figure eight knot, then repeat procedure on other side.





## 4. Bottom Lace

Tie bottom lace through bottom hole # I with figure eight knot (as shown in diagram on previous page), then proceed to loop bottom lace straight through the mesh and then through bottom hole #4, tie START HERE off with figure eight knot.


# 5. Shooting Strings

With underside of head still facing up, start shooting string by tying knot through hole #1 in head (see diagram), then lay string across the mesh and loop through hole #1 on the opposite side. Then proceed to twist back across going over then under the string as shown in the picture. Repeat the procedure for second shooting string, and third (if you prefer).

# 6. Finishing Touches

- Make sure shooting strings are not too tight in mesh or you'll have a whip in your stick.
   ("whip" means when the ball gets caught in the shooting strings)
- Remember, any strings or leathers are limited to a hanging length of 2".
- Attach the appropriate ball stop to the head of the stick.



# BRINE STRINGING TIPS

- 1. It's helpful to have a pair of long nose pliers, a single edge razor blade, a roll of tape and a lighter available.
- 2. Refer to the manual often. If you have a strung head, refer to the head.
- 3. Take your time...don't get frustrated. You can always go back and do it over again.
- 4. After you finish, make sure you cut the excess stringing and melt the ends to a point.



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
